Nancy Jane Lloyd Doty 82 died in Lakeland, FL, on May 24, 2019. She was born in Flint, Michigan on March 13, 1937, to Carman John and Jennie Leona Ruttan Lloyd. She graduated from Mandeville High School in Flint and soon after married Arlin Doty from Alabama who working in Flint. The couple moved from Flint to Estero/Ft Myers, FL, in 1980 and to Lakeland, FL, in 1995. The couple have been members of the Nazarene Churches in Flint, Estero/Ft. Myers, and Lakeland, FL. Nancy was a loving wife for over 63 years, and loving mother for over 62. Complications from auto accident in 1990 had kept her from mobility and the ability to visit with much of her extended family and the friends she so loved over the past years.
