A memorial service will be conducted Thurs. Dec. 1st at 11 am at Gentry Morrison Southside Chapel.



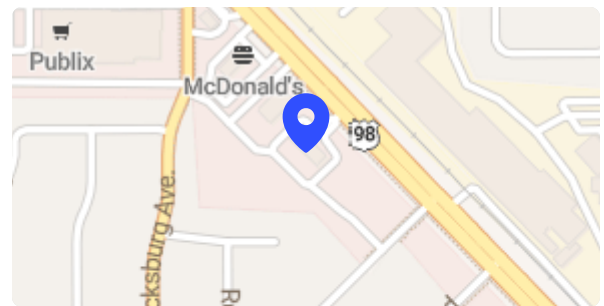

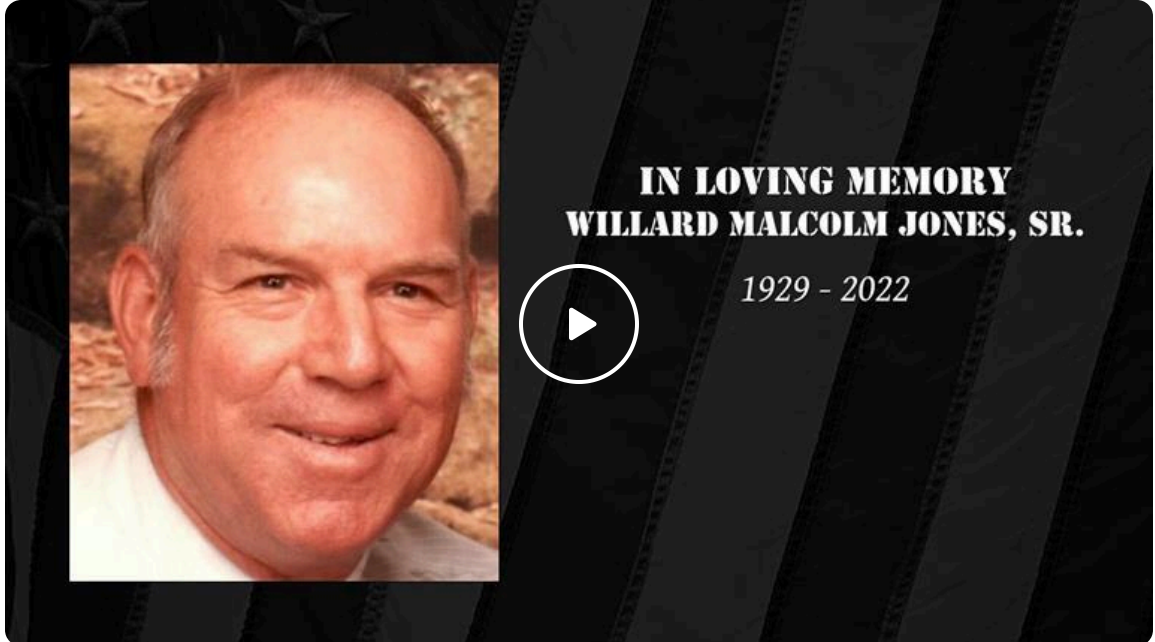
