Fayre P. Ringler was born to Captain Luke R. and Madeline A. Parker of Cambridge, Maryland, on May 21, 1940. She was the youngest of four daughters. She is remembered on the Eastern shore by many nieces, nephews, cousins, and their children, along with several lifelong friends. She attended schools in Cambridge, Maryland, graduating from Cambridge High School in 1958. On April 16, 1960, she married Terry A. Ringler of Easton, Maryland. They made homes together in Easton and Hagerstown, Maryland; Grand Rapids, Michigan; and Lakeland, Florida. Together they enjoyed traveling to many state parks, historic East Coast cities, and to visit friends as far away as the Republic of South Africa. Most importantly they enjoyed studying the Bible, and serving others together.

She was committed to making them feel loved and secure while sharing how to live as a child of God in anticipation of sharing an eternal home with them.

She enjoyed home decorating, watching baseball, jigsaw and Sudoku puzzles, and attending her grandchildren's theatre plays and athletic games. Faye enjoyed sewing clothes, costumes, and gifts for her family. She died February 26, 2020, surrounded by family knowing God's plan for her was perfect.
